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## HISTORY AND PHILOSOPHY OF NSS

In India, the idea of involving students in the task of national service dates back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the nation. The central theme which he tried to impress upon his student audience time and again, was that they should always keep before them their social responsibility. The first duty of the students should be, not to treat their period of study as one of the opportunities for indulgence in intellectual luxury, but for preparing themselves for final dedication in the service of those who provided the sinews of the nation the national goods & services so essential to society. Advising them to form a living contact with the community in whose midst their institution is located, he suggested that instead of undertaking academic research about economic and social disability, the students should do “something positive so that the life of the villagers might be raised to a higher material and moral level”.

The post –independence era was marked by an urge for introducing social service for students, both as a measure of educational reform and as a means to improve the quality of educated manpower. The University Grants Commission headed by Dr. Radhakrishnan recommended introduction of national service in the academic institutions on a voluntary basis with a view to developing healthy contacts between the students and teachers on the one hand and establishing a constructive linkage between the campus and the community on the other hand.

The idea was again considered by the Central Advisory Board of education (CBSE) at its meeting held in January ,1950. After examining the various aspects of the matter and in the light of experience of the other

countries in this field, the Board recommended that students should devote some time to manual work on a voluntary basis and that the teachers should also associate with them in such work. In the draft First Five-year Plan adopted by the Government of India in 1952, the need for social and labour service for students for one year was further stressed. Consequent upon this, labour and social service camps, campus work projects, village apprenticeship schemes etc., were put into operation by various educational institutions. In 1958, the then Prime Minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru in his letter to the Chief Ministers, mooted the idea of having social service as a prerequisite for graduation. He further directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for introduction of national service into the academic institutions.

In 1959, a draft outline of the scheme was placed before the Education Ministers Conference. The conference was unanimous about the urgent need for trying out a workable scheme for national service. In view of the fact that education as it was imparted in schools and colleges, left something to be desired and it was necessary to supplement it with programmes which would arouse interest in the social and economic reconstruction of the country. It was viewed that if the objectives of the scheme were to be realised, it was essential to integrate social service with the educational process as early as possible. The Conference suggested the appointment of a committee to work out details of the proposed pilot project. In pursuance of these recommendations, a National Service Committee was appointed under the Chairmanship of Dr. C.D Deshmukh on August 28, 1959 to make concrete suggestions in this direction. The committee recommended that national service for a period of nine months to a year may be made compulsory for all students completing high school education and

intending to enrol themselves in a college or a university. The scheme was to include some military training, social service, manual labour and general education. The recommendations of the Committee could not be accepted because of its financial implications and difficulties in implementation.

In 1960, at the instance of the Government of India, Prof. K.G. Saiyidain studied national service by students implemented in several countries of the world and submitted his report under the title "National Service for the Youth" to the Government with a number of recommendations as to what could be done in India to develop a feasible scheme of social service by students. It was also recommended that social service camps should be open to students as well as non-students within the prescribed age group for better inter-relationship.

The Education Commission headed by Dr. D.S. Kothari (1964-66) recommended that students at all stages of education should be associated with some form of social service. This was taken into account by the State Education Minister during their conference in April 1967 and they recommended that at the university stage, students could be permitted to join the National Cadet Corps (NCC) which was already in existence on a voluntary basis and an alternative to this could be offered to them in the form of a new programme called the National Service Scheme (NSS). Promising sportsmen, however, should be exempted from both and allowed to join another scheme called the National Sports Organisation (NSO), in view of the need to give priority to the development of sports and athletics.

The Vice Chancellors' Conference in September, 1969 welcomed this recommendation and suggested that a special

committee of Vice Chancellors could be set up to examine this question in detail. In the statement of national policy on education of the Government of India, it was laid down that work experience and national service should be an integral part of education. In May, 1969, a conference of the students' representatives of the universities and institutions of higher learning convened by the Ministry of Education and the University Grants Commission also unanimously declared that national service could be a powerful instrument for national integration. It could be used to introduce urban students to rural life. Projects of permanent value could also be undertaken as a symbol of the contribution of the student community to the progress and upliftment of the nation.

The details were soon worked out and the Planning Commission sanctioned an outlay of Rs.5 crores for National Service Scheme (NSS) during the Fourth Five Year Plan. It was stipulated that the NSS programme should be started as a pilot project in select institutions and universities.

On September 24, 1969, the then Union Education Minister Dr. V.K.R.V. Rao, launched the NSS programme in 37 universities covering all states and simultaneously requested the Chief Ministers of States for their cooperation and help. It was appropriate that the programme was started during the Gandhi Centenary Year as it was Gandhiji who inspired the Indian youth to participate in the movement for Indian independence and the social uplift of the downtrodden masses of our nation.

The cardinal principle of the programme is that it is organised by the students themselves and both students and teachers through their combined participation in social service, to get a sense of involvement in the tasks of national development. Besides, the students,

particularly, obtain work experience which might help them to find avenues of self-employment or employment in any organisation at the end of their university career.

## **NSS – BASIC CONCEPTS AIM OF NSS**

Development of the Personality of Students through Community Service.

### **OBJECTIVE**

The broad objectives of NSS are to:

- Understand the community in which they work
- Understand themselves in relation to their community;
- Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem solving process;
- Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility;
- Utilise their knowledge in finding practical solution to individual and community problems;
- Develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities;
- Gains skills in mobilising community participation;
- Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude;
- Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and
- Practice national integration and social harmony.

### **THE MOTTO**

The motto or watchword of the National Service Scheme is:

**‘NOT ME BUT YOU’**

This reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service and appreciation of the other person’s point of view and also to show consideration for fellow human beings. It underlines that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society on the whole . Therefore, it should be the aim of the NSS to demonstrate this motto in its day programme.

### **NSS SYMBOL**

The symbol of the National Service Scheme , as appearing on the cover page of this Manual is based on the ‘Rath ‘wheel of the Konark Sun Temple situated in Orissa. These giant wheels of the Sun Temple portray the cycle of creation, preservation and release, and signify the moment in life across time and space. The design of the symbol , a simplified form of the Sun-chariot wheel primarily depicts movement. The wheel signifies the progressive cycle of life . It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social transformation and upliftment.



### **NSS BADGE**

The NSS symbol is embossed on the NSS badge. the NSS volunteers wear it while undertaking any programme of community

service. The Konark wheel in the symbol has eight bars which represent the 24 hours of the day. Hence, the badge reminds the wearer to be ready for service of the nation round the clock i.e. for 24 hours. The red colour in the badge indicates that the NSS volunteers are full of blood i.e. lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The navy blue colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is a tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of mankind.



## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME VOLUNTEERS

Since the National Service Scheme is aimed at developing the personality of NSS volunteers through community service, hence, all NSS activities provide an opportunity to NSS volunteers to involve themselves in community service.

### Participation in NSS Programme/Training

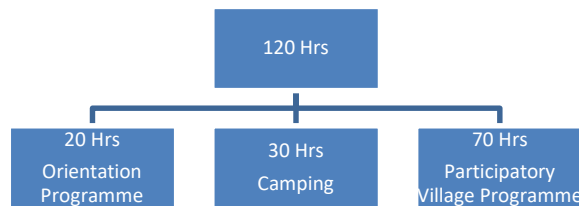
A student enrolled as NSS volunteers will have to put in 120 hours for community work in a year for a period of 2 years. He /she is likely to participate in different programmes and projects under NSS. The distribution of 120 hours on NSS activities is given as under:-

### Orientation

- i. Each NSS volunteer who joined NSS will undergo an orientation in the NSS

programme for 20 hours out of 120 hours. The 20 hours meant for orientation will further be divided as general orientation- 2 hours; special orientation -8 hours and Programme skill learning-10 hours. During the general orientation the NSS volunteers will get to know the history and growth of the NSS programme, aims, objectives and other basic concepts.

- ii. After the general orientation is completed, the students will be given special orientation where information regarding the realities of life pertaining to the community and its problems. Volunteers will be encouraged to know more about the problems of village/urban slums and will be oriented for the schemes which are sponsored by the Government agencies and voluntary organisations in the field of community services.
- iii. The 3<sup>rd</sup> place of orientation will consist of developing programme skills which are essential for community work and completion of NSS projects.



### Duties of NSS volunteer

- a. To establish rapport with the people in the project area;
- b. Identify needs, problems and resource
- c. Plan programmes and carry out the plans:
- d. Relate learning and experience towards finding solutions to the problems



- identified; and
- e. Record the activities in work diary systematically and assess the progress periodically and effect changes, as and when needed

### **Code of Conduct for NSS Volunteers**

1. All volunteers shall work under the guidance of a group leader nominated by the Programme Officer.
2. They shall make themselves worthy of the confidence and co-operation of the group/community leadership
3. They shall scrupulously avoid entering into any controversial issues.
4. They shall keep day-to-day record of their activities/experience in the enclosing pages of the diary and submit to the Programme Officer for guidance
5. It is obligatory on the part of every volunteers to wear the NSS BADGE while on work

### **Certificate**

An NSS volunteer who has completed 240 hours of regular activities in the period of 2 years and attended one annual special camp, will be issued an NSS certificate by the respective university.

### **SPECIAL CAMPING PROGRAMME**

Special Camping forms an integral part of the National Service Scheme. It has special appeal to the youth as it provides unique opportunities to the students for group living, collective experience sharing and constant for group living, collective experience sharing and constant interaction with community. Concerted efforts have to be made for a number of years for reconstruction activities in rural areas and urban slums for improving the living conditions of economically and socially weaker sections of the community. Institutions having NSS have a special role to play in collaboration with other Departments and local authorities

engaged in Development work. They should adopt a village or group of villages/ urban slums for intensive social development, where special camps are organised by them year after year to create tangible and durable community assets.



### **Why Should I Join NSS?**

*“Well, there are many reasons why one should join NSS, I have been the volunteer in my college NSS unit and it has been a fantastic experience since then with them. Some of the main motivating factors of joining NSS according to me are:*

*1. You get to know the society very closely, when you meet new people understand their needs and do good for them in whatever small means your team can, it gives you an inner satisfaction which one can't explain in words.*

*2. You understand the importance of life, when you organise various health camps, blood donation camps and start valuing the things which you have been taking for granted like your health, money sent by family and many more.*

### **THE MAJOR ACTIVITIES OF CURRENT YEAR**

The NSS Units 190 and 191 of Sree Krishna College, Guruvayur stood for the public, all through these pandemic circumstances, closely pursuing the motto of helping the common people in every mode possible. The activities NSS had done were encouraging to the whole College during this desperate period. The adoptive village, Kandanassery Grama Panchayath, had received remarkable ventures all along this Pandemic season.

The tele home care programme *Aashwas* conducted along with the Health Department and Kandanassery Local Self Government was indeed a worthy task, since it was a topic of discussion even in other official venues as well. Our volunteers of Students In Palliative care, *SIP*, a wing devoted for Palliative care, which works along with Thrissur Palliative care Society had given their undivided attention for the Covid 19 patients in the Panchayath locality. The Health Department provided the details and volunteers incessantly cast an eye over the patients and their emotional and mental state. Health Inspectors both Manoj and Binju had guided them unreservedly. Amidst the second wave they were volunteering throughout the day for the welfare of the common public.

The NSS volunteers further did their utmost towards aiding the Kandanassery Health Department. They volunteered during Covid Vaccination process for both registration and actual implementation. A week-long programme *Tika Mahotsav* under

the directions of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports had been conducted and cleared the misconceptions on Covid Vaccination. Likewise, the volunteers of Sree Krishna College, Guruvayur stepped forward to orchestrate an online programme *Virtual Gig*, in order to create an awareness regarding Covid 19 and how to prevent it from spreading. They have also been a part of the Polio Vaccination process in different Primary Health Centres across Kandanassery Panchayath.

NSS 190 & 191 unit of Sree Krishna College designed a project *Thalaphalam* by planting 1000 palm seeds from World Environment Day 05.06.2021 onwards. The estimated project areas were the adopted village Kandanassery Panchayath, premises of volunteers' residential region and college compound. The intention was to protect palm trees and highlight its importance regarding the environmental benefits provided, like protecting from excess soil erosion, the tree is salt and drought tolerant, in addition to its impact in combating desertification and the tree can decrease the atmospheric temperature and the level of pollutants resulting from industrial activities. It can store 10000 to 20000 rain water in the rainy season as well.

Palmyra-palm trees, known by the binomial name *borassus flabellifer*, are drought-resistant and can survive even the harshest of seasons and conditions. It does not need any special care," says botanist Devanathan Krishnamoorthy, mentee of renowned botanist and member of Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board Prof. D. Narasimhan.

Palmyra-palm trees grow well on sandy soil, and that explains why one will usually find them in good numbers along coastal areas. When they are found inland, usually, they would be found planted around

water bodies and along river beds. Our forebears instinctively understood palmyra trees' ability to hold the soil. Palmyra trees have fibrous roots that make them efficient soil binders. There are now research articles that call attention to palmyra trees' ability to recharge the groundwater table. As palmyras have a fibrous root system, each root functions like the main root, and they let multiple probes into the earth looking for water. Many other economic benefits are also there since a palmyra tree can supply materials that go into the construction of houses and the base of a palmyra tree can serve as a pillar, and the stem can go into the making of rafters.

This prestigious project had six phases, thus by planting 1300 palmyra seeds *Thalaphalam* project has been completed and the places are college campus, Ponmala Temple, Randukai Forest, Aanappantham Forest, Kandanassery Grama Panchayat and Erumapetty Gramapanchayath. We are also extending our sincere gratitude to Principal Sree Krishna College Guruvayur, Kandanassery Gramapanchayath, social Forestry Govt. of Kerala, Forest Department Govt. of Kerala, Haritha Kerala Mission Govt. of Kerala, Ponmala Temple Management Alur and Erumapetty Gramapanchayath.

Even during the Covid 19 pandemic, when the world was motionless, NSS activities advanced through various online platforms. The amount of enthusiasm exhibited by the volunteers was admirable. The spirit they had created will continue to encourage the future ventures too. On a larger picture we are attempting to create a sustainable social habitat for a better tomorrow.

## WINGS OF NSS

Sree Krishna College Guruvayur has two well active units of National Service Scheme 190 and 191. We had got opportunities to commit many social services for the society. Kandanassery Panchayat is the adopted village of Sree Krishna College, Guruvayur. Our unit had served our best for the communicative development and environmental conservation of the adopted village.

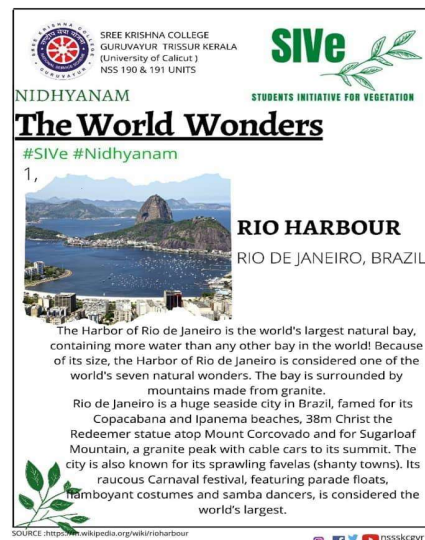
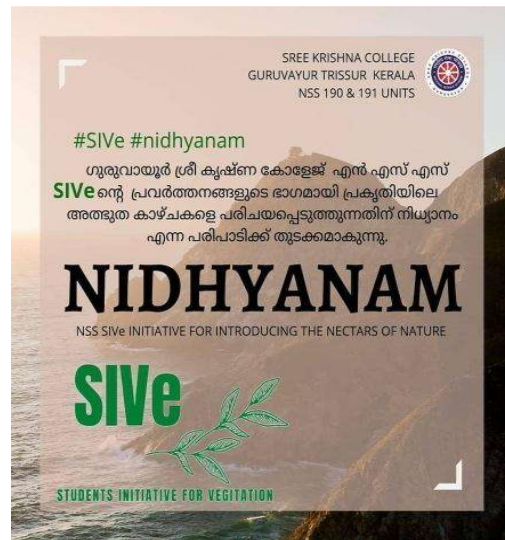
## BIO DIVERSITY DAY

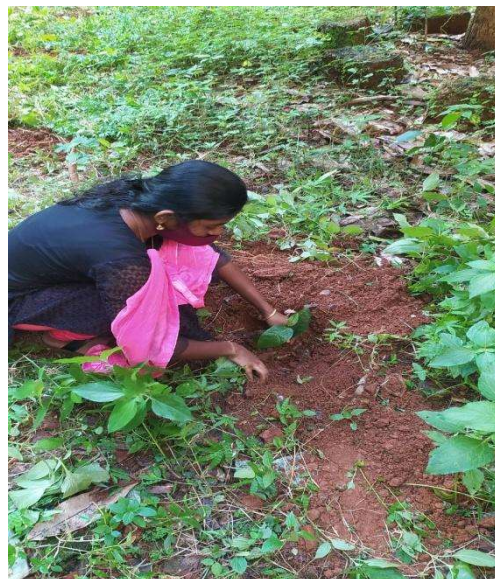


## NATIONAL WEBINAR ON WORLD ENVIRONMENTAL DAY

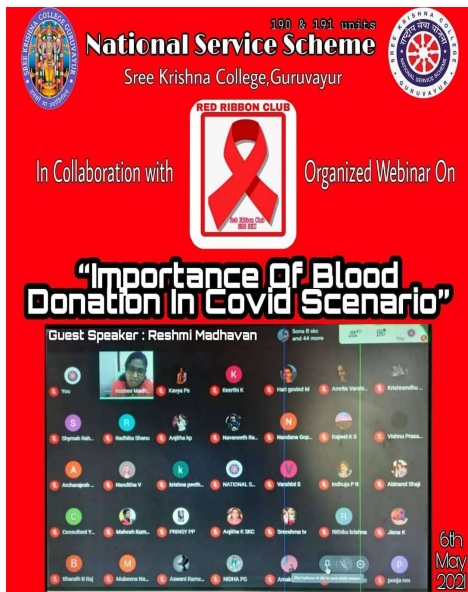
### INAUGURATION OF RED RIBBON CLUB ACTIVITIES

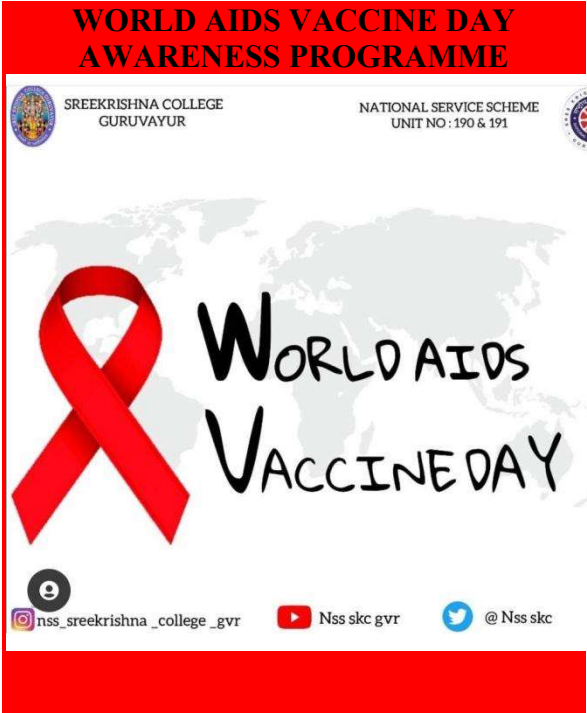
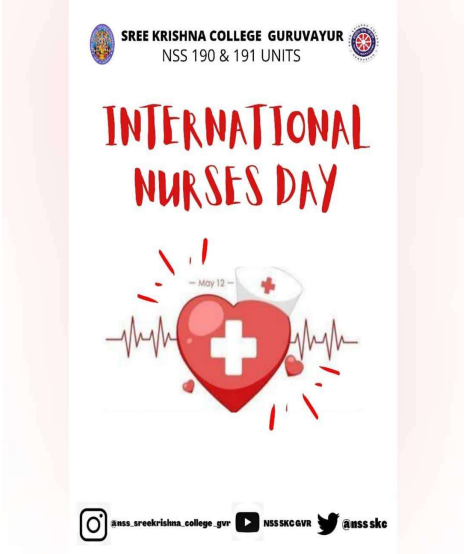

**INTERNATIONAL NURSES DAY CELEBRATION**

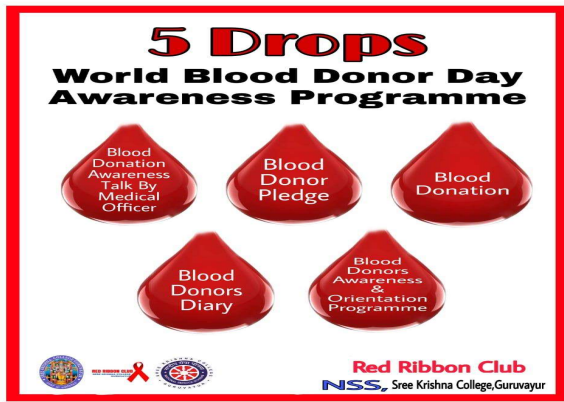

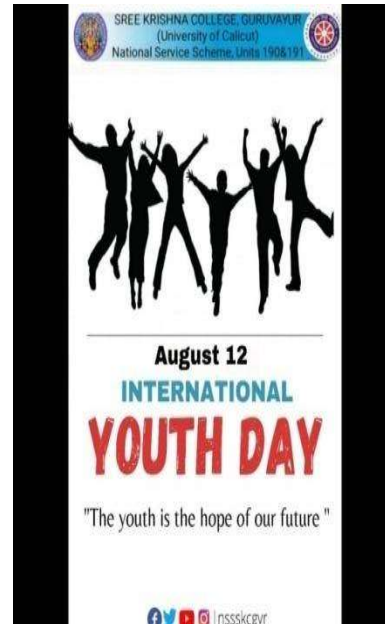
## Blood Donors Awareness and Orientation Program

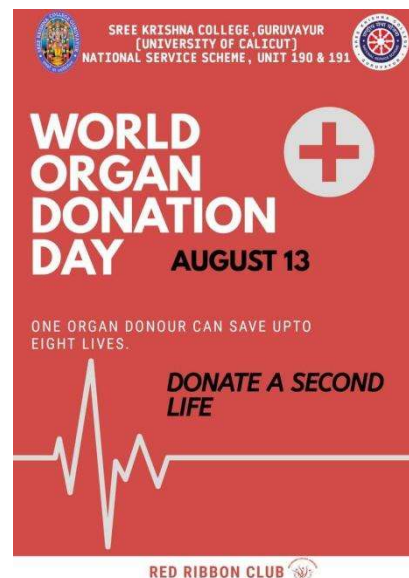
## YOUTH DAY CELEBRATIONS

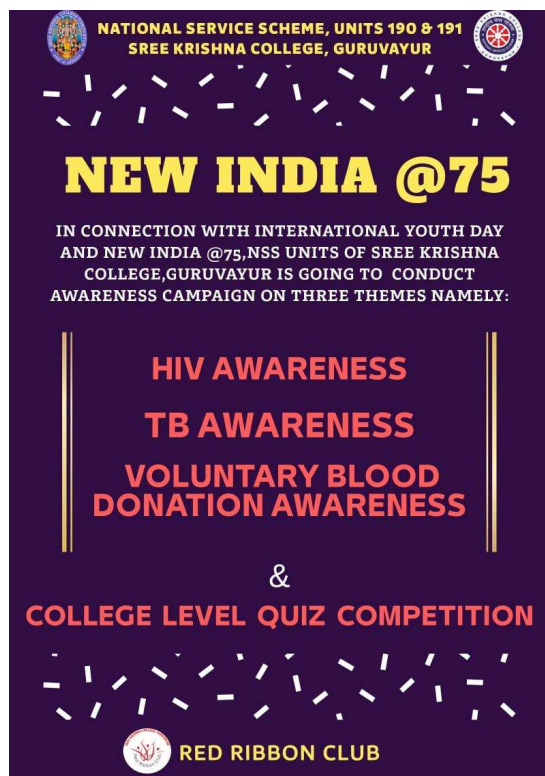


## WORLD ORGAN DONATION DAY

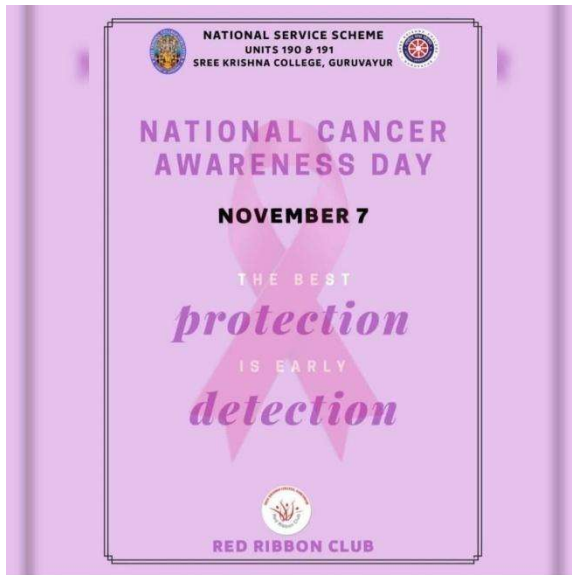

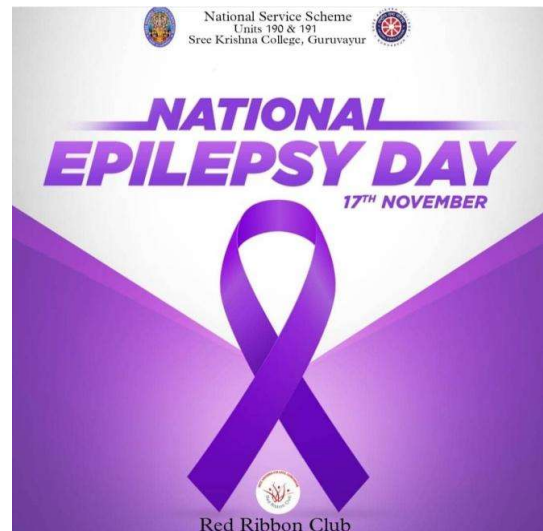

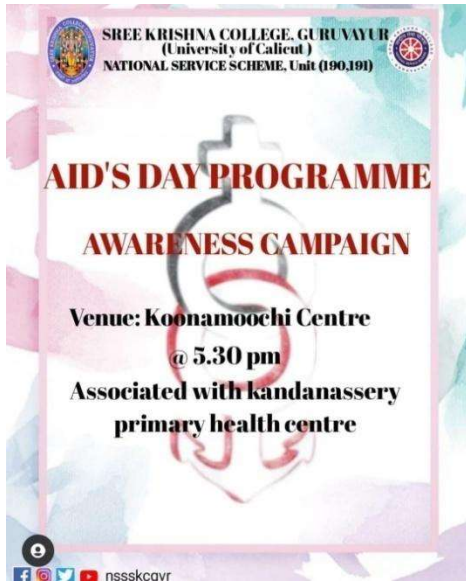

September 08, 2021, As part of International Physiotherapy Day, SIP Volunteers created posters and videos on the basis of the importance of physiotherapy and spread it on social media.

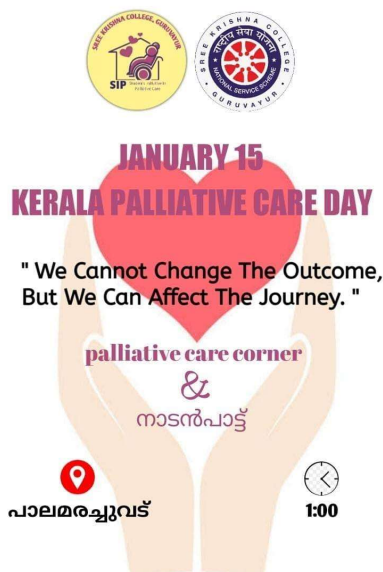
## PANEL DISCUSSION

### INAUGURATION OF VIMUKTHI CLUB ACTIVITIES AND WEBINAR

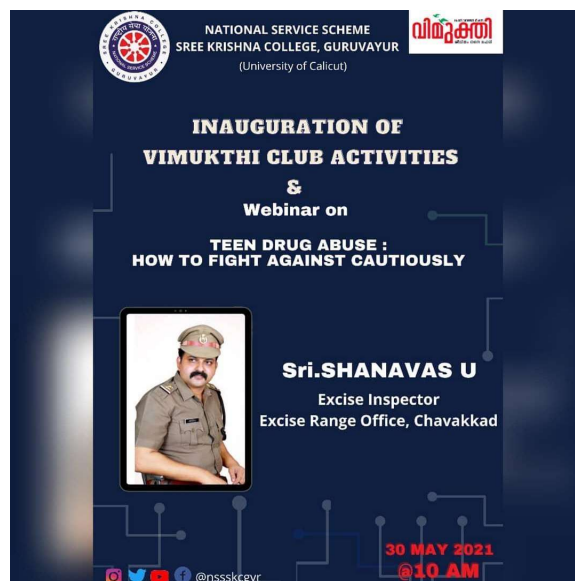

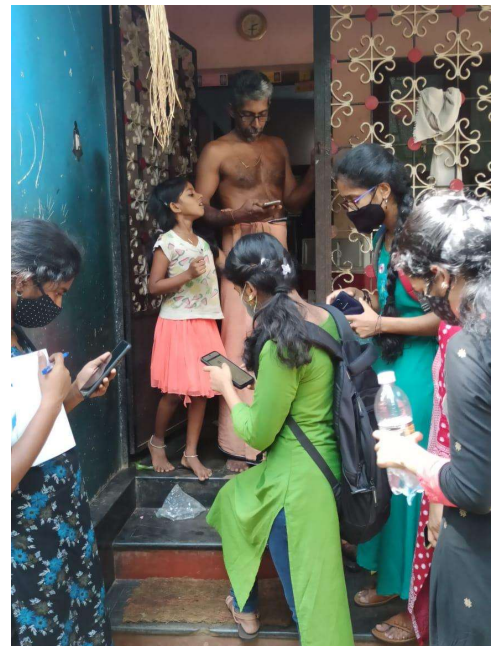

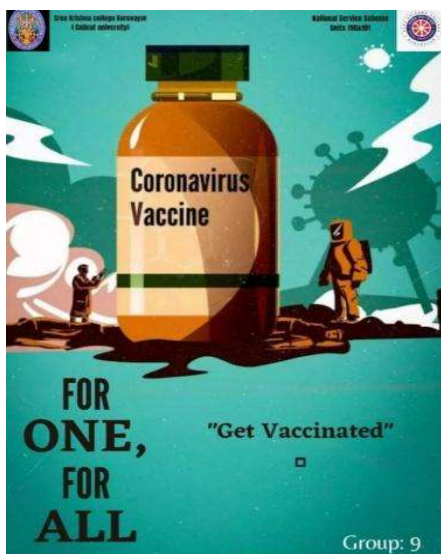
## Day 2 (23/04/2021)

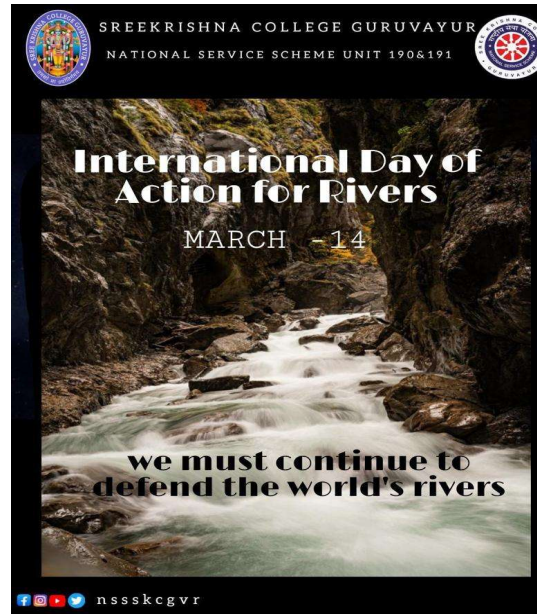
### World Sleep Day March 13, 2022

This day is organised by the World Sleep Committee of the World Sleep Society and aims to lessen the burden of sleep problems within the society through better prevention and management of sleep disorders.



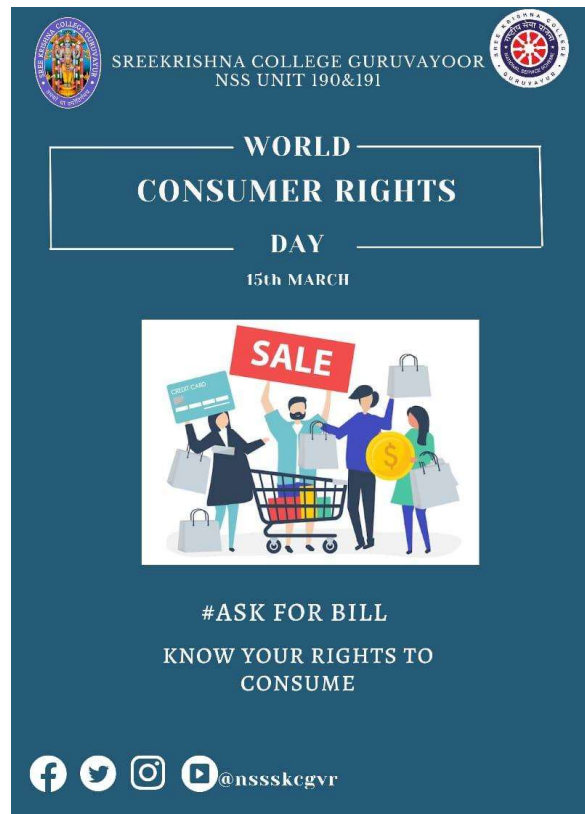
### International Day of Action for Rivers March 14, 2022

## ADOPTED VILLAGE

The NSS Units 190 and 191 of Sree Krishna College, Guruvayur stood for the public, all through these pandemic circumstances, closely pursuing the motto of helping the common people in every mode possible. The activities NSS had done were encouraging to the whole College during this desperate period. The adoptive village, Kandanassery Grama Panchayath, had received remarkable ventures all along this Pandemic season.

The tele home care programme *Aashwas* conducted along with the Health Department and Kandanassery Local Self Government was indeed a worthy task, since it was a topic of discussion even in other official venues as well. Our volunteers of Students In Palliative care, *SIP*, a wing devoted for Palliative care, which works along with Thrissur Palliative care Society had given their undivided attention for the Covid 19 patients in the Panchayath locality. The Health Department provided the details and volunteers incessantly cast an eye over the patients and their emotional and mental state. Health Inspectors both Manoj and Binju had guided them unreservedly. Amidst the second wave they were volunteering throughout the day for the welfare of the common public.

The NSS volunteers further did their utmost towards aiding the Kandanassery Health Department. They volunteered during Covid Vaccination process for both registration and actual implementation. A week-long programme *Tika Mahotsav* under the directions of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports had been conducted and cleared the misconceptions on Covid Vaccination. Likewise, the volunteers of Sree Krishna College, Guruvayur stepped forward

to orchestrate an online programme *Virtual Gig*, in order to create an awareness regarding Covid 19 and how to prevent it from spreading. They have also been a part of the Polio Vaccination process in different Primary Health Centres across Kandanassery Panchayath.

NSS 190 & 191 unit of Sree Krishna College designed a project *Thalaphalam* by planting 1000 palm seeds from World Environment Day 05.06.2021 onwards. The estimated project areas were the adopted village Kandanassery Panchayath, premises of volunteers' residential region and college compound. The intention was to protect palm trees and highlight its importance regarding the environmental benefits provided, like protecting from excess soil erosion, the tree is salt and drought tolerant, in addition to its impact in combating desertification and the tree can decrease the atmospheric temperature and the level of pollutants resulting from industrial activities. It can store 10000 to 20000 rain water in the rainy season as well.

Palmyra-palm trees, known by the binomial name *borassus flabellifer*, are drought-resistant and can survive even the harshest of seasons and conditions. It does not need any special care," says botanist Devanathan Krishnamoorthy, mentee of renowned botanist and member of Tamil Nadu Biodiversity Board Prof. D. Narasimhan.

Palmyra-palm trees grow well on sandy soil, and that explains why one will usually find them in good numbers along coastal areas. When they are found inland, usually, they would be found planted around water bodies and along river beds. Our forebears instinctively understood palmyra trees' ability to hold the soil. Palmyra trees have fibrous roots that make them efficient soil binders. There are now research articles

that call attention to palmyra trees' ability to recharge the groundwater table. As palmyras have a fibrous root system, each root functions like the main root, and they let multiple probes into the earth looking for water. Many other economic benefits are also there since a palmyra tree can supply materials that go into the construction of houses and the base of a palmyra tree can serve as a pillar, and the stem can go into the making of rafters.

This prestigious project had six phases, thus by planting 1300 palmyra seeds *Thalaphalam* project has been completed and the places are college campus, Ponmala Temple, Randukai Forest, Aanappantham Forest, Kandanassery Grama Panchayat and Erumapetty Gramapanchayath. We are also extending our sincere gratitude to Principal Sree Krishna College Guruvayur, Kandanassery Gramapanchayath, social Forestry Govt. of Kerala, Forest Department Govt. of Kerala, Haritha Kerala Mission Govt. of Kerala, Ponmala Temple Management Alur and Erumapetty Gramapanchayath.

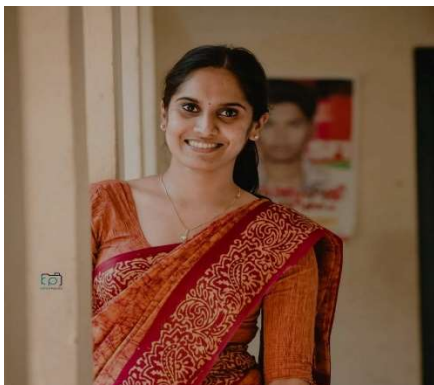
## CONCLUSION
