
STUDENTS SATISFACTION SURVEY REPORT 2021-2022

According to the UGC guideline, it is mandatory for the College to conduct the Student Satisfaction Survey to upgrade the quality of higher education in the Teaching-Learning process. The questionnaire is prepared according to the UGC-NAAC guidelines. The student is directed to respond to all the questions given in the following format with her/his sincere effort and thought. Inorder to ensure that the responses are unbiased a pilot survey was primarily conducted among the students; including both postgraduate and undergraduate students, to identify the difficulties and expectations of students on various facilities provided in the College. On the basis of the pilot study and based on the guidelines provided by NAAC a pre-structured questionnaire was designed by incorporating all the variables identified in the pilot survey. All the questions were rated on a five-point scale with scores 5,4,3,2 and 1 respectively. All the responses were analysed on a percentage scale and a pictorial representation was also done for easy evaluation.




How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 718 responses




4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as




5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.

Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.






7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.








10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.






12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.




13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.
















20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good

The Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted to get an overview of the courses, College, faculties, teaching-learning process, and various facilities provided by the College. From the survey, it is clear that more than half of the students were gratified with the teaching-learning practices in the College and the relationship and rapport between teachers and students. More than 80% of the students opined that the teaching-learning practices provided in the College are good. Teachers support them in co-curricular activities and even for their continuous improvement through mentoring and other student-friendly programmes.

In addition to the responses, the students were asked to provide three major suggestions for our betterment. The major suggestions put forth are stated below:

Major suggestions are highlighted below:

- o All the PG departments have ICT classrooms but in addition to this UG classrooms should be converted to Smart Class Rooms.
- o Industrial visits and Fieldwork is part of the Curriculum but due to the pandemic situation, the Government put restrictions on field trip. The students raised the suggestion to organise more Field work to get practical exposure.
- o Effective communication must be developed and must support extracurricular activities.
- o Learner-friendly classrooms will help successful learning.
- o Lab facilities should be improved to meet the needs of complementary students too.
- o Arrangements should be made to keep the campus premises a little more clean.
- o Institute should take an active interest in promoting internships.
- o Behavioral awareness in education can be promoted
- o Colleg should take the initiatives to encourage nature clubs, games clubs, etc.
- o Provide placement assistance after graduation itself.
- o Increase the amount of scientific exposure and resource person talks whose well versed in science/respective departments.
- o Providing enough scientific temper as well. Field trips related to the subject would be beneficial as well.
